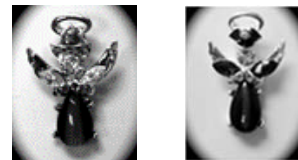

At the October board meeting the board initiated a 2.5% floor for the DROP interest rate. This also applies to DROP balances left at OPF for those who have retired.

Medicare members enrollment period is open until December 7th, 2019. To qualify for the stipend, you must use Aon for your part B or D coverage. Members seeking to change carriers must call Aon for an appointment.

Non Medicare members enrollment period opens November 1st 2019 and ends December 15th, 2019. This group does not have to utilize Ehealth for their selection. They can purchase a valid ACA accredited health care plan from the market. The member is still responsible for submitting claims through Aon/Alight for the stipend. All 88 Ohio counties offer ACA accredited plans.

Legislative Agents

The Ohio State legislature began session and committee hearings again in mid-September following summer recess. The beginning of a renewed session brings new members and leadership appointments, as well as a renewed focus on legislative priorities.

In the past few weeks, several members of both the Ohio House and Ohio Senate have announced their resignations or have been appointed to the higher chamber. The resignation announcements of Senators Uecker and Terhar spurred two new Senate appointees – Terry Johnson and Bill Blessing. Blessing was serving as a State Representative at the time of his appointment, so his departure leaves another seat open in the Ohio House. This is coupled with the departure of former House Speaker Ryan Smith to serve as the President of Rio Grande Community College and University.

In early October, the Ohio House began making several adjustments to committee leadership and makeup to accommodate for members leaving and new members being confirmed. Major House committees, including Health,

Education and Ways & Means have received new chairmanships and members. As the committees' leadership and composition change, deference towards priority legislation and vote counts are also expected to slightly differ from what they were prior to summer recess. The legislature will work to adjust to these changes and continue hearings on important legislation.

Almost all priority legislation introduced earlier this year at the beginning of the General Assembly has been passed. The House and Senate have reexamined their main legislative concerns for the rest of the year. The House is focusing on energy issues such as grid modernization, education issues including school funding and report cards, and a new drug pricing pilot program. The Senate is focusing on criminal sentencing reform, workforce development and kinship care.

In addition to reengaging in these policy priorities, the state government is looking ahead to the state capital appropriations budget. Capital Budget negotiations began a few months after the biennial operating budget passed in July.

The legislature will confer on this appropriations bill when it is introduced by the Governor, likely beginning after the New Year.

Bill Tracking

HB 143 – Tax Credit: to grant income tax credits to person who serve as volunteer peace officers, firefighters, or emergency medical technicians

HB 291 – Privileged Communications: to provide privileged testimonial communications between a peer recovery supporter and a fellow first responder exhibiting signs of distress

HB 308 – PTSD Coverage: Concerning worker's compensation and disability retirement for peace officers, firefighters, and emergency medical workers diagnosed with post-traumatic stress disorder arising from employment without an accompanying physical injury
